# TOWN MEETING WARRANT Tuesday, March 29, 2016

To Gerald E. Grierson Sr., a resident of the Town of South Thomaston, in the County of Knox, State of Maine,

#### **GREETINGS:**

In the name of the State of Maine, you are hereby required to notify and warn the voters of the Town of South Thomaston in the County of Knox and State of Maine, qualified to vote by law in Town affairs, to meet at the Gilford B. Butler School in said Town on Tuesday, the 29th day of March 2016 A.D., at seven o'clock in the evening, then and there, to act upon the following articles to wit:

Article 1. To choose a moderator to preside at said meeting. **Mike Mayo 3 votes** 

Article 2. To elect by ballot one Selectboard member, one Assessor and one Overseer-of-the-Poor for a term of three years.

Walter Reitz 63 votes, Carolyn Neagle 25 votes

Article 3. To see if the Town will vote to authorize payment to the Selectboard members and Assessors quarterly.

Article 4. To see if the Town will vote:

- (i) to authorize the Town to continue as a member of the Municipal Review Committee, Inc. ("MRC"), organized as a Maine nonprofit corporation and acting as a regional association pursuant to Title 13-B and Title 38 of the Maine Revised Statutes, as amended (and specifically Section 1304-B (5-A) of Title 38) for the purposes of managing and facilitating solid waste disposal;
- (ii) to adopt, ratify and confirm the Restated Articles of Incorporation and the Restated Bylaws of the MRC in substantially the form on file with the Town Clerk at the Town Office;
- (iii) to authorize the Town to execute and deliver a Municipal Joinder Agreement with the MRC in substantially the form on file with the Town Clerk at the Town Office (the "Municipal Joinder Agreement") pursuant to which the Town will become a Joining Member of the MRC (as defined therein) and deliver its municipal solid waste for disposal to a waste management facility being developed by Fiberight, LLC and/or its affiliates (collectively, "Fiberight") in Hampden, Maine, or other waste disposal facility;
- (iv) to authorize the MRC to take certain actions on behalf of the Town as set forth in the Municipal Joinder Agreement; and
- (v) to authorize a majority of the Selectmen or their duly authorized designee or designees as a representative of the Town to execute and deliver the Municipal Joinder Agreement on behalf of the Town and to execute and deliver on behalf of the Town in conjunction therewith such other documents and to take such further actions as they may deem

necessary or appropriate in order to effect the transactions contemplated by the Municipal Joinder Agreement.

Article 21. To see if the Town will vote to authorize the Selectboard to accept or dispose of all equipment.

Article 22. To see if the Town will vote to authorize the Selectboard to transfer funds from unexpended balances and surplus as it deems necessary.

Article 23. To see if the Town will vote to authorize the Selectboard to make application for and execute any documents on behalf of the Town related to federal, state, grant and or other funds and to accept said funds if awarded and to authorize their expenditure.

Article 24. To see if the Town will vote to accept the following method for collecting taxes: taxes to become due October 3rd, 2016. An interest rate of 7.00 % per annum will be charged starting October 4th of the current year. Requests for abatements are to be made within 185 days of commitment.

Article 25. To see if the Town will vote to authorize the Tax Collector to give a 1% discount on any portion of property taxes paid on or before June 1st of the current year.

Article 26. To see if the Town will vote to authorize the Selectboard to expend funds from the Fire Truck Repair Reserve under such terms and conditions as the Selectboard deems advisable.
