

I would like to introduce myself. My name is Amy Dyer I have been contracted through St. George Association for South Thomaston Ambulance as the new Ambulance Director. I am a Paramedic from Waldo County and I work for Belfast Ambulance full time. I am also the EMS Director for St. George Ambulance.

The goal in 2018 is to have two per diems on Monday through Friday 6 am to 6 pm and attempt to cover with the highest licensed level. Our volunteer EMS would take call out nights and weekends with shift pay. Primary mutual aid agreement is with St. George to assist when needed and secondary mutual aid will be Rockland and Thomaston.

We have received the new defibrillator/monitor that is in service as of February 2018 called Zoll X Series Manual Monitor/Defibrillator. This monitor is the top of the line. It comes with Real CPR Help, pacing technology and much more.

Community Paramedicine is now available to all South Thomaston residents and information will be at the Town Office in February. This service is when EMS coordinates with PCP or ER doctors to come into the home for after care and follow up.
